


Kathy Sue Parker and Steve Scott have been chosen by the seniors to escort them in their graduation activities. They served as mascots at our homecoming activities also.

David Nichols played on the boys' basketball team for three years. He is president of the Student Council Association this year. He is also sports editor for the Eagle.






Our sophomore year was really the hardest. We made the decisions for our futures that year, and had to decide on a general or academic diploma.
